***Coordinated Entry is required for all services***

Housing Focused, Year-Round, Overnight Sheltering and Services for Homeless Adults: Diversion, Standby, Reserved Bed, and Sober Dorm Programs. Showers, Lockers, Mail, Breakfast, Lunch and Supper.

**Intake is 5-7pm.**

Clients who are not enrolled in the (exempt) Reserved Bed Program have a 90-night limit (Oct-Sept).

## **Coordinated Entry (CE)**

**How to Access Adult Homeless Services in Boulder County:** Your first step to receiving services from Boulder County or the cities of Boulder or Longmont is by contacting CE. This is a required step for anyone seeking homeless-related services. You will talk with a staff person and go through a short assessment. Based on that information, you will be referred to the most appropriate services given your needs. CE is available in both Boulder and Longmont. Services may include shelter; help identifying housing options, basic-needs services, case management & more.
