Coordinated Entry (CE):

*required for all services.*

Your first step to receiving services in the cities of Boulder or Longmont is contacting CE (available in both cities). This is a required step for anyone seeking homeless-related services.

You will complete a short assessment and based on that information, you will be referred to the most appropriate services given your needs. Services may include shelter; help identifying housing options, basic-needs services, case management & more.
